Everyone has an image of God in their mind from which they live their Christian life. Sadly, it is often distorted or misinformed.

Why is our understanding or picture of God so critical?

1. It profoundly affects the way we relate to God.

If we have a vague, fuzzy and impersonal picture of God, then our relationship with God usually turns out to be vague, fuzzy and impersonal. Or if we picture God to be against us or always out to get us, it will be highly unlikely that we will want to get too intimate with God. Or if we feel that we have to earn God's love, then we will spend our lives huffing and puffing trying to put ourselves into God's good books.

How we understand God influences powerfully the nature of our relationship with God!

It is only by knowing God, correctly, that we can understand correctly how we are to live – what He actually expects from us.

2. Our picture of God rubs off on us!

We become like the God we worship. If we believe God is violent, we will tend toward aggression. IF we understand God to be against certain people, we will be opposed to them as well. If we see God as overly serious, we will most probably come across as heavy ourselves.

It would seem that we shape our picture of God and then that picture of God shapes us.

Knowing who He is defines who we are.

If we mis-define God we mis-define everything else.

Those who operate on the wrong information aren't likely to know the reality of God's presence in the decisions that shape their lives, and they will miss the constant divine companionship for which their souls were made. We can be robbed of the real joy that comes from knowing intimately the most "joy filled being in the universe" – the God of Scripture.

How is our understanding of God Developed?

- 1. Instructionally → We live our lives at the mercy of our ideas; this is never truer than with our ideas about God.
 - **A.** As children we learn about God from our parents:
 - (1) They teach (2) They modeling
 - B. Church / Preaching / Leaders Modeling
 - C. Biblical teaching and reading.

ILL. People with poor or defective vison need glasses to put print and people in focus. In the same way we need Scripture to bring into focus our genuine sense of God. We all have some inkling of God, but it is vague and smudged. Biblical truth serves as the lens that will get that picture in focus and allow us to think correctly about his character, his redemptive work, His Son, His Spirit and our relationship to Him.

God has given us all the information we need to live as we ought in the Bible. However, the Doctrine of God is not presented in scripture as a set of well-organized theological tenets unrelated to the realities of everyday life. He has chosen to reveal Himself – His character in the context of real life – in relationships with real people.

2. Experientially →

The Disciples understanding of spiritual things was often faulty; their misunderstandings of Jesus were frequent; yet Jesus was able to touch and transform their lives beyond the limits of what had entered their minds, simply because they loved him, trusted him, wanted to learn from him and honeslty meant to obey him according to the light they had. Often their understanding of what had happened to them came after the fact.


Because God is gracious, he may deepen our life in the Spirit even when our ideas about this life are nonexistent or even wrong – provided that we truly desirous to know him better.

3. Relationally \rightarrow This is the primary way He relates to us.

We are relational beings and that is so because we are made in His image. Just as the divine Persons live in intimate Trinitarian relationship, even so must human persons find fulfillment and be complete in intimate relationships with God and others.

The aim of God in history is the creation of an all-inclusive community of loving persons with God himself at the very center of this community as it prime Sustainer and most glorious Inhabitant.

Ill. Boy, How do I build a relationship with her? Tell about yourself

That's what God has been doing in history and in **scriptural revelation.** Telling us who He is! Telling us how He works and what His purposes in the world are.

1. In Scriptural Revelation:

He is: Creator, Holy, Holy Love, Good, Sovereign, Wise, Full of Grace . . .

2. In Scriptural Relationships:

God's character and nature is revealed to us in the interaction of relationships.

- A. Adam and Eve –" walked"
- B. Abraham, Isaac and Jacob Faithful
- C. Moses

Ex. 32-34

¹⁸And he said, I beseech thee, <u>shew me thy glory</u>. ¹⁹ And he said, I will make all my goodness pass before thee, and I will <u>proclaim the name of the LORD</u> before thee;

⁵ And the LORD descended in the cloud, and stood with him there, and proclaimed the name of the LORD. ⁶ And the LORD passed by before him, and proclaimed, The LORD, The LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth, ⁷ Keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, and that will by no means clear the guilty; visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children, unto the third and to the fourth generation.

There may be no more significant Old Testament description of how God relates to His people than this Hebrew word *hesed*. I argue that the best translation of this term would be "loyal love." Hesed is difficult to translate because it stands for a cluster of ideas—love, mercy, grace, kindness. It wraps up in itself all the positive attributes of God. Hesed is one of the Lord's most treasured characteristics.
